Main purpose

The teacher will:

- Fulfil the professional responsibilities of a teacher, as set out in the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document

Duties and responsibilities

Teaching

- Plan and teach well-structured lessons to assigned classes, following the school's plans, curriculum and schemes of work
- Assess, monitor, record and report on the learning needs, progress and achievements of assigned pupils, making accurate and productive use of assessment
- Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of pupils
- Set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils
- Promote excellent progress and outcomes by pupils
- Demonstrate excellent subject and curriculum knowledge
- Demonstrate their quality of teaching is 'good' to 'outstanding'
- Participate in arrangements for preparing pupils for external tests

Whole-school organisation, strategy and development

- Make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school
- Work with others on curriculum and pupil development to secure co-ordinated outcomes
- Provide cover, in the unforeseen circumstance that another teacher is unable to teach

Health, safety and discipline

- Promote the safety and wellbeing of pupils
- Maintain good order and discipline among pupils, managing behaviour effectively to ensure a good and safe learning environment

Professional development

- Take part in the school's appraisal procedures
- Take part in further training and development in order to improve own teaching
- Take part in the appraisal and professional development of others, where appropriate



Communication

· Communicate effectively with pupils, parents and carers

Working with colleagues and other relevant professionals

- Collaborate and work with colleagues and other relevant professionals within and beyond the school
- Develop effective professional relationships with colleagues

Personal and professional conduct

- Uphold public trust in the profession and maintain high standards of ethics and behaviour, within and outside school
- Have proper and professional regard for the ethos, policies and practices of the school, and maintain high standards of attendance and punctuality

- Administrative tasks including maintenance of DofE records, ordering of welcome packs, ordering of equipment, maintenance of equipment, etc.
- Manage and lead activities and expeditions during and outside normal school hours ensuring all activities are risk assessed and submitted to the Evolve system appropriately for approval.
- Support D of E participants as they progress through their programme and maintaining communications with parents.
- To liaise with outside organisations to find and promote opportunities for students to complete the sections of their Award.
- Promotional and outreach activities to staff, parents and pupils to boost participation.
- To participate in CPD opportunities to develop good practice.
- Submission of programmes for approval to the DofE Award Verifier.
